Spelled S-T-A-R-E.

Translated to French: regarder fixement.

Stare is a regular verb: to stare, stared, stared.

When you stare, you look at something or someone for a long time without looking at anything else.

Here it is in an example sentence:

- "My cat sits on my bed and stares at me. That's how I know he's hungry!"
(Mon chat s'assoit sur mon lit et me fixe du regard. C'est comme ça que je sais qu'il a faim).
- "Don't stare at people, it's impolite!"
(Ne fixez pas les gens du regard, c'est impoli).
