This week we have two words:

1. **to take off**
2. **to land**

Both of these verbs are used in the context of air travel.

Translated French:

- *to take off* = *décoller*
- *to land* = *atterrir*

Don't forget that "*take*" is always an **irregular** verb (*take, took, taken*).
"*to land*" is a **regular** verb (*landed*).

Here both verbs used in an example sentence:

"The aeroplane took off from Paris and landed in New York."
(*L'avion a décollé de Paris et a atterri à New York*).
